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

The event was organised by The Imperial Society of Innovative Engineers and the students had designed an electric car, which runs on solar energy.





4. AIOUS FORMULA STUDENT, the official FSAE team of Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University, successfully participated in SUPRA SAE INDIA 2016, held at Buddh International Circuit, Greater Noida from 4th July to 9thJuly2016. Aious Formula Student was awarded with the "Best team Award with maximum Girls Participation" this year in the competition out of the 180 teams that participated from various technical colleges all over India. The team also received a cash prize of a Rs. 25000.



Hybrid energy

Priyanka Sehgal, team captain, fourth year, ECE, Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women, showcased a smart grid project in an exhibition organised by Power Grid Corporation of India. She shares her experience



The team with a working model of the smart grid project

he most fascinating aspect of the smart grid technology is the use of renewable resources. Hybrid micro grid is a stand-alone electricity supplying grid, which harnesses energy from renewable sources such as wind, solar, biomass and battery (for back-up) and supplies it to a remote location where it is not feasible to connect with the main grid. In times of crises, the grid will not be dependant on utilities and will continue to supply electricity.

To construct a working model of the grid, we divided all the devices and equipment in two categories — critical and non-critical load based on the importance of where the electricity was needed. Electricity to the critical load would be supplied through battery. In our model, we used a software — LabView, which helped us to acquire data, do the algorithm, and send the command.

For us, researching, compiling information and ideas on the smart grid technology took time. Our biggest challenge was to choose a software, which was user-friendly as well as suitable for the project. We knew that even though the migro grid is not a replacement for the national grid, it worked wonders in communities and regions that have adequate renewable resources.

In the future, we would like to design a micro grid model that takes real-time data and make a smart metre.


ANIMAL CARE






GENDER SENSITIZATION

LEAP: KILKARI


LEAP aims at the sustainable development of a community in the field of education. Focusing on one locality of New Delhi, that is Kashmere Gate.

TEACH




LEAP: SOCIAL LIBRARY
