• Placement for Academic Year 2022-23:

The placement drive for the session 2022-23 commenced from August 2022. 372 students have received returning offers/placement in top Tech companies like Google, Microsoft, Goldman Sachs, Adobe, American Express, Amazon, Uber, Intuit, Atlassian, and many others. The highest CTC offer received is ₹ 54 Lakhs by Microsoft. In addition, 58 students have received the package of ₹40 Lakhs and above. The average salary received by the students for the pre-placement offers so far is ₹35 Lakhs CTC. The placement drive of UG and PG programs are still on-going for the year 2022-23.

- C. Professor of Practice funded on Honorary basis

It further suggested that the Professor of Practice in University at any point in time, should not exceed 10% of the sanctioned posts of the University. These engagements will be over and above of sanctioned posts of the University.

The engagement may be initially for up to one year and subsequent extensions. At the end of the initial engagement or subsequent extension, the University will make an assessment based on contribution and requirement of the experts engaged as Professor of Practice and take the decision about extension of tenure. The maximum duration of service at a given institution should not exceed three years and is extendable by one year in case of exceptional cases and the total service should not exceed four years under any circumstances.
