The Member Secretary welcomed the Hon'ble Chairperson and the esteemed members of the Academic Council. After brief introduction, the Agenda Items were placed before the Academic Council for consideration. The agenda-wise recommendations of the Academic Council are as under: -

#### Item No.14.01: Opening Remarks by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor

The Vice Chancellor welcomed all esteemed members of the Academic Council. She informed that the University is conducting online classes as per the Academic Calendar of the University. The Vice Chancellor apprised about the accolades and achievements received by the University attained after conduct of 13<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council:

- The University has been honoured with the prestigious 'University of the Year Award' in the category of universities in existence for 1-10 years, at the recently concluded FICCI Higher Education Excellence Awards 2021 ceremony.
- Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women (IGDTUW) has been the flagbearer for the unique "Education Mentoring Programme" in collaboration with Govt of NCT of Delhi. Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia launched the programme on 20th March 2021. The programme was attended by principals, teachers and students of 184 Delhi Govt Schools. The programme will focus on mentoring of girls studying in classes 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. In the first phase, 250 mentor leaders (students of IGDTUW) will mentor 1000 mentees (government school students) and in Phase 2 they will mentor approximately 8000 to 10,000 students studying in classes 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. They will work as Social Ambassadors for knowledge dissemination and hand holding of mentees.
- The University successfully conducted its **Third Convocation** on 28th December 2020 in blended mode. The Convocation was attended by Hon'ble Dy. Chief Minister of Delhi as Guest of Honor, Prof D.P. Singh, Chairman UGC as the Chief Guest. The University conferred degrees to 359 Undergraduate students, 119 Post Graduate students and 09 PhD Students. Two Chancellor awards, Eleven Vice Chancellor awards and One Exemplary Performance award were given to the students for their outstanding performance.
- University conducted **Second Alumni Meet and Industry Institute Networking Meet** on 28th December 2020. Prestigious alumni awards were presented to various passed out students of the University who have made the University immensely proud. The Outstanding Young Alumnus Award for outstanding involvement and achievement in post-graduate education, community contributions and career advancement were conferred to the alumni. The Rising Star Award was presented to alumni in recognition of their significant contribution through professional work.
- IGDTUW has been ranked as **Innovative University in World University Ranking Impact 2021 (WURI Ranking)** at 64<sup>th</sup> position (up from 77<sup>th</sup> position secured last year) The University has also bagged 16<sup>th</sup> position (up from 21<sup>st</sup> position secured last year) under the category **Entrepreneurial Spirit** in WURI Ranking 2021.
- For the first time, IGDTUW participated in the prestigious Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2021. IGDTUW has made India proud by ranked in the band of [101-200] for Sustainable Development Goals namely SDG- 4[Quality Education] and SDG-5 [Gender Equality] among all Universities of the World.
- The University has been selected as **Nodal Centre for Toycathon-2021** conducted by Govt. of India.

During the deliberations, it was suggested that the Python Programming be taught in place of Prolog/Lisp in Course Code BCS 301 – Artificial Intelligence. Topics like Tokenization, Stemming, Lemmatization etc. be included besides adding few more case studies by adding real life examples. The Council appreciated the commencement of B.Tech-ECE (AI) Programme by the University. During deliberations, it was also suggested that Industry representatives be included in the Committee while framing the Teaching Scheme and detailed syllabus. The Council also suggested that sufficient emphasis should be given on honing the coding skills of the students. Council also suggested that a number of expert sessions from the Industry Experts be organized during the semester to integrate real-world applications into classroom lessons. With these suggestions, the Academic Council approved the commencement of new B.Tech. - ECE (AI) Program along with teaching scheme and syllabus of 1<sup>st</sup> year in the Department of ECE from Academic Year 2021-22 with intake of 75 students including all reservation.



## Item No.14.09: To consider and approve guidelines for the award of credits for Generic Open Elective Course (GEC)

After due deliberation, the Academic Council approved the guidelines for the award of credits for Generic Open Elective Course (GEC). The Council also suggested including Education Mentoring Programme as a GEC Course.

With these suggestions, the Academic Council recommended the revision in Ph.D. Regulations 2019.
